Barn Rules

Initial Costs – Animal Only

- Pig Purchase Price – \$245.00 this year (includes entry fee)
 - From CFISD Breeder
- Westgreen Barn Rental – \$155.00 rent fee, which \$100.00 (Refundable) If Pen is Cleaned a week After Show
- Initial Shots During Selection – \$10.00
 - Will be paid cash to CyLakes FFA prior to selection
- TOTAL COSTS = \$ 400.00



Initial Costs - Supplies

- Feed Storage Container – Trash Can W/ Chain and Lock – \$40.00
- Rake - \$15.00
- Whip - \$10.00
- Shampoo/Conditioners- \$15.00
- Brush - \$7.00
- Fan - \$25.00
- Zip Ties / Fly Strips / Gloves – \$35.00
- Plywood - \$25.00
- Feed Trough / Hog Panel - \$25.00
- Bleach - \$5.00

TOTAL COSTS — \$200.00 +,



Recurring Costs — SHAVINGS

- Shavings — Changed Every two Weeks for 18 WEEKS
 - ACE — \$5.50 a Bag (4 Bags per Change) = \$22.00
 - \$22.00 X 9 Changes for the Project = \$198.00
 - HAY Bale
 - Cold Winter Months — Split W/ Buddies - \$9.50 per Bale
- TOTAL ACE - \$200.00***

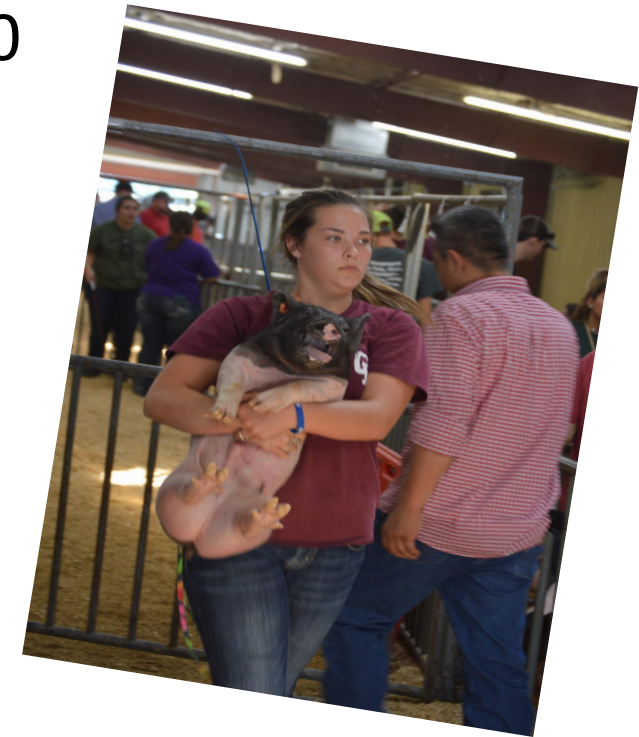


Recurring Costs — FEED (PURINA)

BASED on MY Feeding Schedule

- 309 Starter Feed - \$33.50 Per Bag — Requires 2 Bags - Total = \$67.00
- 709 Grower Feed -\$24.00 Per Bag — Requires 3 Bags — Total = \$72.00
- 809 Finisher Feed — \$23.00 Per Bag — Requires 2 Bags — Total = \$46.00
- Oat Groats — \$26.00 Per Bag — Requires 1 Bag - Total = \$26.00

Total Feed Bill = \$211.00



Other Expenses

- Prospect Shows - \$20.00 to \$40.00 Per Show
- Veterinarian Bills - \$40.00 to Unlimited (Hernias, Diarrhea, Pro-Lapse, Broken Legs, X-Rays, Medications, Barn Visits, ETC..)
- Fuel / Time – Travel to Barn – TWICE DAILY
- Fuel / Time - Travel to Feed Store / Shavings Pick – Up
- Fuel / Time - Travel to Prospect Shows
- Fuel / Time - Travel to Navasota (VET Clinic)
- Clipping Fees Prior to SHOW – \$20.00

Estimated TOTAL = \$ 150.00 to \$1000



Time Spent for Project

- Project Time – 126 DAYS
 - Morning Routine – (BEFORE SCHOOL) 30 Minutes to 1 Hour
 - Cleaning Pen, Feeding Animal, Walking Animal, Getting Clean for School
 - Afternoon Routine – (AFTER SCHOOL) 1 Hour to 1 ½ Hours
 - Cleaning Pen, Feeding Animal, Walking Animal, Weighing, Washing, Brushing, ETC.
- Holidays During PROJECT – Labor DAY, Thanksgiving, Christmas
- Project Still Needs to be FED, WALKED, WASHED, Pen CLEANED, ETC..
- **DO NOT NEGLECT** – PIGS WILL FORGET HOW TO WALK AFTER CHRISTMAS (2 WEEK BREAK) This Time is VERY CLOSE to Show and will be Detrimental to a Good Showing in February

Total Costs for Swine Project

- Total Costs of Project are \$1044.00 to \$2000.00
 - Depending on Unexpected Costs (Vet, Prospect Shows, Etc.)

 - Buyer Lined up - \$1500.00
 - Donations – \$100.00
 - Freshman Expenses (\$1200.00) Minus Monies Earned (\$1600.00)
 - Total = (\$400.00 Rolled OVER TO 2014)



Cost Offsets

- 2014 – (Freezer Sale) Pig Diagnosed with Hernia
 - Buyer Lined up – \$450.00
 - Donations – \$1150.00 (Buyer Lined UP) Gave Extra in Donations
 - Total Expenses (\$1400.00) Vet Bills for Hernia, Travel to Navasota Twice)
 - Total monies Earned – \$1600.00
 - Total = (\$200.00 Rolled OVER TO 2015)
- 2015 – (NO Sale) Pig Received a Broken Leg – Occurred In trailer going to V
 - Freezer Sale - \$0.00
 - Donations – \$2050.00 (\$1500.00 from Lined Up Buyer)
 - Total Expenses (\$1600.00) Vet Bills, Travel to Montgomery County, Pig Disposal)
 - Total monies Earned – \$1900.00
 - Total = (\$300.00 Rolled OVER TO 2016)

What to feed??

Pigs will come from the breeder on Show Chow 509

If you are feeding Purina
you will stay on 509

Purina 509

It is highly suggested you give your pig a joint supplement.
Such as Glucosamine, Chondroitin, and MSN. We will have
more information about these on the sunday after pig
selection.

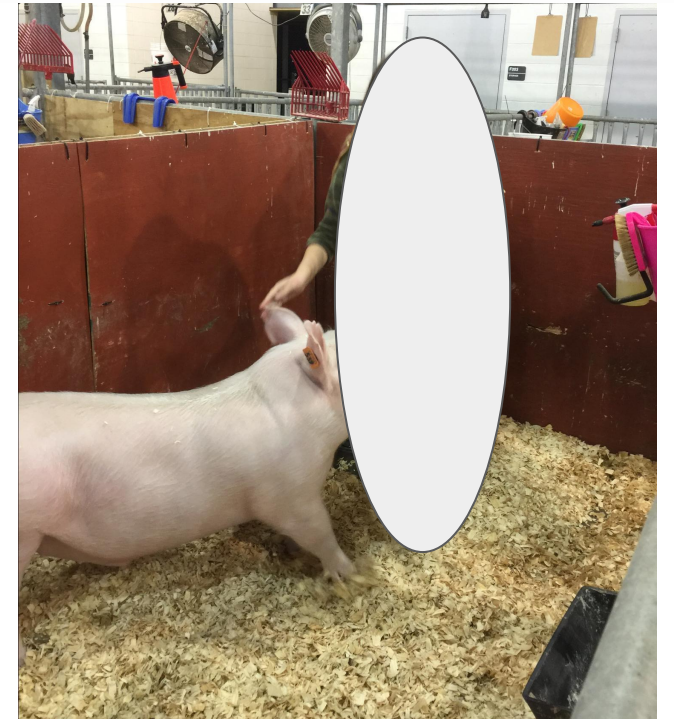
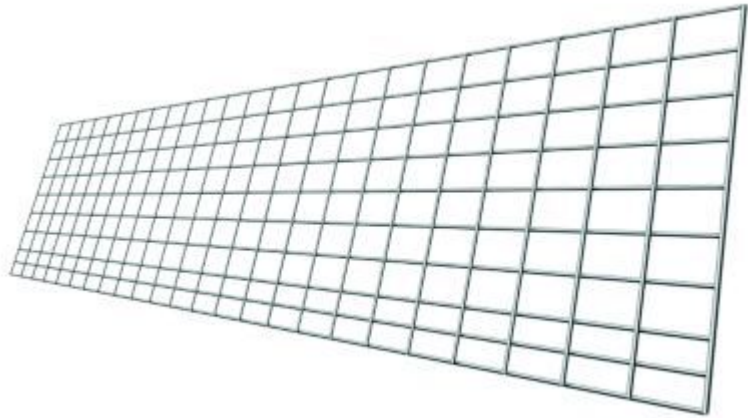
If you are feeding Lindner's you will need
to buy one bag of 509 to mix with your
Lindner's 632. You should do this over a
week period, by slowly mixing in the
lindners into the 509. This way the pig
will not get scours.

Lindner 632

After the first few weeks we will have a feed specialist come in
and help each of you with your feeding schedule.

Pen setup -

- **Beach your pen's floor and railings using a mixture of 3 water to 1 bleach solution.**
- **Check out rubber mats from the Ag. Dept. to put underneath your shavings in the floor of your pen.**
- **Hog Wire for feed trough. Zip ties, a lot of zip ties.**
- **Put up plywood around the sides of your pen, you can work with your neighbors so you don't have to double buy.**
- **You can add a tool box to store feed and other supplies in your pen.**
- **Put down your shavings.**

What to do

If your animal stops eating.....Tell an Ag. Teacher first

If your animal has diarrheaTell an Ag. Teacher first

If you are going out of town and someone else in the barn will be feeding for you.....Tell an Ag. Teacher.

If you need a Veterinarian to come out to the barn and Ag. Teacher MUST be present.
